






#### List 3 values that matter to you



#### The 13 Most Common Dilemmas

- 6. You can get a fair outcome by playing dirty.
- 7. Skirting the rules achieves some good.

- 8. Misrepresenting the truth helps.
- 9. Someone deserving your loyalty now needs your help.
- 10. Personal values conflict with your job.
- 11. You have an unfair advantage.
- 12. You made a mistake that's costly to fix.
- 13. Someone comes to you seeking mercy.
